

Data Storytelling (or How to Tutor Graphs)

Abstract

When a student shows up with a graph in their paper or presentation, it's easy to tell when there is something problematic about the graph. Articulating what that is, however, might be harder, and giving firm advice on a graph is often outside of a tutor's comfort zone. This webinar would provide tutors that are nervous about giving feedback on graphs with some tips and strategies, including how to focus on the purpose of the graph, how to emphasize and deemphasize information, and how to declutter.
